You are invited to the 37th Annual Session of North Pacific Yearly Meeting, to be held **July 15-19, 2009, at the University of Montana in Missoula, Montana**. Those Friends who live in the western part of our region will get another opportunity to travel through striking scenery to the beautiful state of Montana and perhaps add on some time in the mountains before or after Annual Session.

**Program Information**

**WORSHIP GROUPS**

*Worship Groups meet daily to help us know one another on a deeper level.*

Some will be **Intergenerational** (includes Junior and/or Young Friends), others will be **Adults Only**.

The following types are offered this year:

**[WS] WORSHIP SHARING**

Worship centering on a theme or a set of queries. The patterns of unprogrammed worship apply: each person who wishes may respond to the query but does not respond specifically to someone else's contribution; each participant speaks only once to any query; the group returns to silent worship between contributions.

**[WD] WORSHIP-DISCUSSION**

Similar to worship-sharing, but with more speaking. Participants may respond directly to what someone else has said, and may speak more than once to a topic, with space for everyone to contribute and to return to silence between contributions.

**[WW] WORSHIP-WALKING**

Walking together in worship with periodic stops to respond to the queries from one's experience.

**[WM] WORSHIP WITH MUSIC**

This is worship with sung ministry instead of spoken ministry, returning to silence between contributions. Participants are encouraged to bring songs that will contribute to a sense of deep worship. Instruments (non-amplified, please) are welcome but not required.

**[UW] UNPROGRAMMED WORSHIP**

Traditional unprogrammed worship in the manner of Friends.

**INFANTS – 5<sup>TH</sup> GRADE**

The Children's Program offers age appropriate activities for children from infants through 5<sup>th</sup> graders during Worship Groups, Interest Groups and Plenary Sessions. Parents or sponsors sign children in and out of every session.

**CHILD CARE**

In addition to, and separate from, the Children's Program, there will be **limited** child care during the Committee meetings on Wednesday and the Meeting for Worship for Memorials on Saturday and the Worship Sharing for Children's Program Staff on Thursday and Saturday.

This Child Care is intended only for young children whose parents are attending these meetings.

**CENTRAL FRIENDS**

Central Friends are middle school aged Quakers who have completed 5<sup>th</sup> grade up through the summer before they enter 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Their program is structured and runs concurrently with the adult program.

**JUNIOR FRIENDS**

Junior friends are a lively group of Quakers from every corner of North Pacific Yearly Meeting who have completed 8th grade up through the summer after graduation from high school. Their program is self contained. They will finalize their plans at their first business meeting on Wednesday evening. They usually participate in intergenerational worship sharing with the rest of annual session.

## Travel Information

**!!! Time Zone Change:** Missoula is on Mountain Time, 1 hour ahead of Portland, Seattle, and Eugene !!!  
Please take the time change into account when planning your travels.

### PARKING PERMITS

Parking permits are required 7a.m. - 5p.m. Monday through Friday.

If you paid in advance, pick up your permit as quickly as possible upon arrival to avoid a ticket!!! Pre-paid permits will be available at the registrar's table during posted registration hours.

Or,

If you didn't pay in advance, you can park in one of the hourly lots for 75¢ per hour. Bring lots of quarters!

### DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA CAMPUS:

#### **WEST BOUND I-90:**

1. Take Missoula's first exit #105 onto Van Buren Street, turn left at the stop sign and merge into the right lane.
2. At the stop light, turn right onto Broadway street.
3. Move into the furthest left lane, and turn left onto Madison at the stoplight.
4. Driving over the bridge, stay in the left lane, and veer left at the fork in the road. After the fork, keep to the left and turn left onto 6th Street at the stop light. After making a left, get into the right lane. You will be heading due east and directly in front of you will be the Adams Center. You are now on campus.

#### **EAST BOUND I-90:**

1. Take Missoula's last exit onto Van Buren street, Exit 105. Turn right at the stop sign and merge into the right lane.
2. Follow steps 2-4 from above.

#### **FROM MISSOULA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT:**

1. Leaving the airport, turn right onto Broadway Street.
2. Take the first left leading you to the entrance of East Bound I-90.
3. Follow I-90 and take Missoula's last exit onto Van Buren Street, turning right at the stop sign.
4. Follow steps 2-4 from above.

#### **FROM HIGHWAY 12 & 93 NORTH:**

1. Highway 12 & 93 become Brooks Street through Missoula. Follow Brooks Street through Missoula to Higgins Avenue. Brooks Merges with Higgins at Hellgate High School.
2. Be sure you are in the right lane, and turn right onto Sixth Street.
3. Follow Sixth Street for six blocks to the entrance of campus.

## Costs for Attending

### FEES:

Housing	\$20 to \$27 per day*	See the Registration Fee Calculation Worksheet of a list of prices and options.
Meals	Varies*	Two types of meal packages are available: Daily or Entire session. See the Registration Fee Calculation Worksheet of a list of prices and options. Friends can purchase individual meals using cash.  No one can enter the dining hall, even infants/toddlers, without a meal card or cash.
Annual Session Fee	\$64 or \$16 per day	Covers costs of holding Annual Session, such as supplies and snacks for the Children's Program, office supplies, Fee Waivers for staff, meeting rooms, Audio-video equipment, and items we rent.
Parking Fee	\$3 per day	UM charges for parking from 7am to 5pm, Monday through Friday.

\*PLEASE NOTE: A "Day" runs from Dinner each day through lunch the following day, except for parking.

The maximum cost of attending per person is:

Adults:	\$260	Children, 5 thru 11:	\$216
Children, 12 thru High School:	\$260	Children, 0 thru 4:	\$100 + \$18 cash for meals
